

President's Message Marty Burbank, President



Sept. 11, 2001, changed more than the skyline of New York City - the attacks changed a generation of Americans. The loss, as profound as it

was, did not break the soul of this nation. It made us stronger. It created a time when all Americans, while still grieving over the tragedy and treasure lost, were also filled with pride and patriotism, and created a spirit of service. That day fundamentally changed our nation. We now observe Patriot Day annually on Sept. 11 as a National Day of Service and Remembrance for the thousands of lives lost in the 9/11 attacks. We also remember those rescue workers and others exposed to the toxins during the cleanup; and military and civilian combatants in the 20year war on terror.

We have all been touched by the events of that day. Unfortunately, I am not the only one to have lost friends and teammates during that time.

Scott Helveston was one of my instructors in the Navy. He was a phenomenal athlete, and we always knew it would be a long hard day when he showed up to train us. Scott was working for Blackwater Security during the first battle for Falluja when pictures of Scott and three other contractors burned bodies hanging from a bridge appeared in the paper across the country.

My friend Dan Healy served at Seal Delivery Vehicle Team One. Dan was the Senior Chief Seal in charge of a rescue team sent to save Lt. Michael P. Murphy (Medal of Honor), Markus Lutrell, and two other Seals, depicted in the book and Movie Loan Survivor. Dan's whole squad was killed when an RPG hit the Army Special Forces Helicopter, inserting them.

Steve Smith and I went through training together, and both ended up at SDVT-1. After Steve returned from Afghanistan, he took his own life like many other veterans suffering from PTSD. Louis Langlus was my roommate. Over a 25-year career, Lou rose to become a senior leader at Seal Team Six, which killed Osama Bin Laden. Lou was one of 30 Americans who lost their lives when their helicopter was hit in Afghanistan on Aug. 6, 2011 — the deadliest day for U.S. troops in Afghanistan.

So on this 20th anniversary, I ask you to remember all of those who died on that day and not forget the sacrifices so many made when they were given the call.

Great news!

The Roosters Foundation, through our Feeding OC program are sponsoring Bracken's Kitchen during the next 6 months.



During this time, we are distributing food in many ways at each event, ideally twice a month for a total of 12 events. At times we will be giving hot meals, frozen meals and sometimes boxes of food.

Some of the events are at the direction of Bracken's Kitchen, through their research and relationship finding the most needy families and kids. At other times, the Roosters Foundation will recommend charity partners, such as the Boys and Girls Club of Buena Park, suggested by our own Rick McCauley. Thank you Rick.

Our goal is to distribute food to at least 250 people at each event. Bracken's staff will create and provide the meals. In addition, when dry or canned food is available from Bracken's resources, we may need 3-4 people to help box food for an event distribution. See the schedule below. Bracken's staff and Rooster volunteers will help distribute the meals to the local charities, sometimes needing 4-8 Rooster volunteers. 
