Next step is for the members of the Grant Review Committee to review the results of the committee's work and they will meet in person to determine what percentage of the available funds each of the applicants will receive. Once our upcoming fundraising events are concluded, the board of directors will review the recommendations of the Grant Review Committee and monies will be distributed appropriately.

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

I would like to serve on the Roosters Board for 2022.



something no family should ever have to endure. His total time of treatment was two years and seven months. Through progression, Liam's end of treatment date was scheduled for September 2021, but due to protocol changes for Liam and his younger brother, Nathan, we were given the option to complete treatment ten months early. Thankfully and joyfully, Liam got to ring the bell in January 2021. This was right before his 7th birthday. Liam is about to enter second grade and is excelling amazingly.

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
