## President's Message Marty Burbank, President

Spring Is Here!

Spring is always my favorite time of year. Everything is new and fresh. This is especially true this year. While not completely behind us, soon, COVID will be something we lived through.



For the Roosters, this is the year for new life and new growth. With the inclusion of women in our club, Roosters is on its way to a fresh path. Since I joined the Roosters back in 2005, there has always been significant conversation regarding bringing in new, young, and energetic members to ensure the mission of the Roosters (serving children) continues. Those younger energetic potential members we say we want, want to be part of inclusive organizations. And they are right, there are many good reasons organizations should be more inclusive.

McKinsey & Co., a management consulting firm, published a report, "Diversity Wins". They found that companies in the top quartile for gender diversity on the executive teams were 25 % more likely to have above-average profitability. This is one of the many reasons I am excited to have women finally joining our ranks. We already have two more incredible women entering the pipeline for membership.

I encourage each of you to think about Diversity and Inclusion and consider recruiting quality people that may have felt uncomfortable or disinterested in the past because of past culture that excluded women.

How do you nominate someone? The rules for who can be a member of the Roosters have not changed. The rules were set out and approved many years ago by past boards. This process remains unchanged. Any

member may nominate someone they believe would be a good Rooster and who will support the Rooster's mission "To facilitate and encourage lifelong friendships while performing charitable works on behalf of children in need." The proposed candidate gets published in the Crow, (which is distributed to every member). Any member who has good cause why a potential candidate should not be approved for membership may bring their concerns to the board. The board then meets and interviews the candidate. After all of the above steps are taken, the board then votes to approve or not to approve the candidate's membership in the Roosters.

We have all seen it over the years. Some people join Roosters, but we do not do a great job of truly embracing those new members. It is even more challenging over the last year because of Covid. As the elected President, I call on all Roosters to reach out to our new members and make sure they feel included in our organization.

## Charity Focus: StandUp for Kids

StandUp for Kids is a non-profit dedicated to ending youth homelessness, and will be applying for a Roosters Grant this year. The executive director, Justine Palmore, will give a five minute presentation at the Roosters April luncheon.

Who they are:

We are a caring community for homeless and at-risk youth ages 12-24 with a 90% success rate transitioning them from crisis to self-sufficiency. We give our youth a sense of safety, hope, and belonging through street outreach, success centers, mentoring, housing support and relationships with trusted, caring adults.

### April Luncheon Speaker

Shelley Hoss, is the President and CEO of the Orange County Community Foundation, the organization which manages our Roosters Foundation investments.

Shelley Hoss has combined the best of the nonprofit and corporate worlds for the good of the community for more than 30 years. Since May 2000 she has served at the helm of one of Orange County's most prominent philanthropic organizations— the Orange County Community Foundation.

Under Hoss' leadership, the Community Foundation has become recognized as a "center of gravity" for philanthropy in Orange County. Her impact on the growth of the organization has been dramatic. Annual grant and scholarship awards have surged more than ten-fold, from \$5 million when she joined OCCF in 2000 to \$102 million in 2020. During the same period, assets stewarded by the Foundation have increased from \$43 million to \$477 million. She will discuss all of the benefits of working with O.C.C.F.

### Charity Committee

In March, the Rooster Board approved an extra \$50,000 to be distributed to the Rooster supported Charities. This was done now (rather than waiting until fall) to assist many of the Charities who have been having funding challenges due to the Covid pandemic.

We distributed the money to the charities which were provided grants in December of 2020, and at the same ratio.

The advocates have received responses from very grateful Charities. Reading some of the responses is heartwarming and assures that Roosters is making a very positive impact on our communities.

## The Accident Injury — Law Center —

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Moses Yneges is the founder of The Accident Injury Law Center, a law office representing plaintiffs in personal injury cases. He never provides defense representation to at-fault parties. Representation is on a contingency fee basis, which means no upfront or hourly fees. Legal fees are collected at the end of the claim, when the other side pays either a settlement or a court ordered amount.

Call Moses to discuss any injuries that resulted from the following types of accidents: semi-trailer truck caused injuries or death, car versus car, any motor vehicle versus pedestrian, any motor vehicle versus motorcycle, dog bite, trip and fall, wrongful death, vehicle roll over, and vehicle seatback failure.

Just because an injury cannot be seen does not mean it is not there. Injuries to the spine and brain can sometimes be difficult to show. Moses has experience with representing clients with internal injuries such as traumatic brain injuries, ongoing pain in the neck that radiates to the arms, ongoing pain the back that radiates to the legs, and post-traumatic stress disorder.
