On Friday, 4/30 at 10 AM at Bracken's Kitchen, volunteers: Stephanie Bauer, Jon Giberson, Cat Richards & me package 50 bags with dry or canned food, masks and small bottles of hand sanitizers. Cat Richards of Bracken's Kitchen received the donated food boxes of items from local sources, totaling approx. 20 pounds each.




