



Holiday Food Drive - it's back!

On December 17th, we are planning to package 1,000 boxes with fresh produce and food for a Christmas dinner.



We will begin contacting the 60 charities we provided boxes to in the past to determine the number of boxes desired. We will need approximately 100 or less volunteers at the Orange County Food Bank. We will be extending an invitation to all Rooster members to volunteer first, before offering to other individuals. The registration process is being reviewed. Two lines of 40 volunteers. Produce to be defined prior week, based on available items.

Basic schedule:

8:30 AM volunteers arrive, enjoy donuts, bagels and coffee
8:45 AM presentation of process
9 AM begin boxing
Forklifts from 10 docks, 5 per side, to bring boxes on pallets outside or cars pick-up at dock
9:30 cars & trucks arrive to line up for pick-up
10 AM begin box pick-up
10:30 AM boxing completed
11 AM pick-up completed

Each committee member was assigned five charities to review and then shared that information with the committee. Namely, Orange County based charities serving at-risk kids.



Our end product is a report for the Grant Review Committee (GRC) to help them determine the amount of money to grant each charity applicant. The GRC is led by the Charity Chair as a non-voting member and consists of the President, Vice President, Immediate Past President, Chair of an event (Chefs event, etc.) and three Roosters members not on the Board of Directors. 





Summer Harvest

During the school year, thousands of students in Orange County rely on their schools for daily meals and essential nutrition. During the summer months, however, these children are often left without enough food. Summer Harvest, a nonprofit organization run 100% by volunteers, is stepping in to help.





For many families in the Los Alamitos Unified School District, summer can

be filled with stress as 1,450 children in the district can be at risk for food insecurity. Food insecurity, the lack of enough healthy food, is an issue in every

community. To meet this need, Summer Harvest was developed with a clear vision to eliminate food insecurity for school-aged children in affluent communities where children do not qualify for federal summer food programs and other programs.

As a 100% volunteer-based 501(c)3, their mission is to provide healthy meals to families with children on the federal lunch program, during the summer and winter holiday breaks from




school. Summer Harvest

Moses Yneges is the founder of The Accident Injury Law Center, a law office representing plaintiffs in personal injury cases. He never provides defense representation to at-fault parties. Representation is on a contingency fee basis, which means no upfront or hourly fees. Legal fees are collected at the end of the claim, when the other side pays either a settlement or a court ordered amount.

Call Moses to discuss any injuries that resulted from the following types of accidents: semi-trailer truck caused injuries or death, car versus car, any motor vehicle versus pedestrian, any motor vehicle versus motorcycle, dog bite, trip and fall, wrongful death, vehicle roll over, and vehicle seatback failure.

Just because an injury cannot be seen does not mean it is not there. Injuries to the spine and brain can sometimes be difficult to show. Moses has experience with representing clients with internal injuries such as traumatic brain injuries, ongoing pain in the neck that radiates to the arms, ongoing pain the back that radiates to the legs, and post-traumatic stress disorder.
