








Charity Committee

Roosters works hard throughout the year to raise money that provides grants to numerous charities supporting at-risk kids and their families throughout Orange County. Whether that manifests through personal donations, our golf tournament, or the Food & Wine Celebration, personal commitment and hard work make it happen. The culmination of that is delivering grant checks to our charities.

The Charity Sub-Committee, comprised of Jill Caron-Rauen, Lou Gardner, Doug Richards, Paul Robidoux and I met four times over the summer and fall to assess and review the grant applications submitted by 31 charities. We used a ranking system supported by the Roosters Procedures Guide and Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs to produce a report for the Grant Review Committee to use as a tool as they made the recommendations for the final dollar grant awards.



On November 9th the Grant Review Committee that included Kirk Adams, Jeff Austin, Jill Caron-Rauen, Gary Draper, Joann Leatherby, Bill Ross, Steve Smith and I met to review this information and make the determination of how much money to grant to each charity applicant. Every charity supports a worthy cause, but like the Charity Sub-Committee, this committee focused on the mission of the charity and how it relates to the Roosters own mission to support these various charities.

The grant checks will be given to Charity Advocates at the Roosters December Lunch on Saturday, December 10th. All Advocates should attend! Even if you're not an Advocate, you should attend as well. The December Lunch is always festive as spouses and significant others are invited and other festivities are on the docket. The icing on the cake is seeing the checks handed out, a manifestation of a year of hard work.
