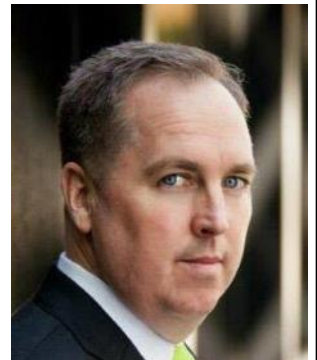

On behalf of the homeless women and children we serve, thank you for your recent donation of \$5,000.00 to Colette's Children's Home (CCH). In 2021, we had requests from 2,474 homeless women and children seeking shelter and supportive services.
