Guess What? The world's longest study on happiness is now in its 85th year.



Researchers at Harvard have been studying a pool of subjects and their descendants since 1938. Their objective: To unlock the age-old question of what makes a happy and successful, good life.

Originally, there were 724 participants. 268 were sophomores at Harvard and their ranks included future President, John F. Kennedy, and future Editor of the Washington Post, Ben Bradley. The study later included a parallel tracking of 456 less privileged, inner city Boston people. Thereafter, the pool was expanded to incluude1300 descendants, both men and women. Astonishingly, the rate of retention was 84%. Every two years, the participants answered lengthy questions in writing, every five years, they submitted their medical records, and every 15 years, they submitted to face-to-face interviews.

So, what's the life lesson? Good relationships, which keep us happier, healthier, and help us live longer. Isn't that what Roosters is about? Of course, we cannot overlook exercise and helping the less fortunate. These relationships are what the experts call "Social Fitness". What is that? It's the finding of the researchers that people who are the best at what they do are the happiest, healthiest, and live longer by maintaining their relationships, actively seek out new ones, and keep in regular contact with friends, family, and community. Get this, it is never too late to do this. So, let's all grow with Roosters together!
